The lineup includes Treehouse Wildlife Center at Noon, Serengeti Steve's Reptile Experience, as seen on America's Got Talent, from 1 p.m. to 2 p.m. and local music by The Lodge Brothers Bluegrass and The Buckhannon Brothers.

Learn from River Bend Yoga (located on State Street in Alton) with donation based yoga sessions at 12:30 p.m., 2 p.m., 3:30 p.m. and 5 p.m. to benefit TNI's mission of preservation, restoration and education.

Guests will be able to enjoy local, tasty treats from Old Bakery Beer Company, Shivers Frozen Custard, Eppel's Pantry, St. Louis Kettle Corn, B & C Concessions and Community Cultivators,



who will be selling healthy side items as a fundraiser for Grassroots Grocery and to help grow the Discovery Garden.

"This year's festival is gearing up to be the largest one yet," said Amy Curry, outreach coordinator for TNI. "We have 66 total vendors and environmental non-profits that have signed up to share their goods and missions with our guests."

She continued to thank the public for the amount of support the event organizers have received from the community and that it "displays how environmentally conscious our Riverbend citizens can be."
